SYNOPSIS

A woman defies the odds, fighting for survival.

At age 33, Verônica Almeida discovers that she has a rare type of Ehlers-Danlos syndrome, a rare degenerative disease that affects the production of collagen, making her joints and vascular tissue fragile. As a result, Verônica quickly loses control of her movements and ends up in a wheelchair. Her heart weakened by the disease, doctors only give her a year to live.

Following medical recommendations, she started swimming. Nine years later, against all odds, she is not only alive, but became a key athlete in Brazil's Paralympic Swim Team after winning a bronze medal at the Beijing Paralympics Games.

But winning Olympic medals is not enough for Verônica. She decides to attempts a 12-km swim across the Bay of All Saints from Mar Grande to Salvador de Bahia, butterfly style, with only one arm. If she succeeds, she'll earn her place in the Guinness Book of World Records and make history, something her children will never forget.

Breaking Tides tells the moving story of a woman with an incredible desire to push the limits imposed on her by life. It is an inspiring film about courage, family, sports, resilience, and willpower.

Writer and Director

Claudia Gama is Canadian emergent filmmaker with Brazilian origins. She has a PhD in educational technologies and worked as a researcher and lecturer for 15 years prior to start documentary filmmaking in 2008. In 2011, she enrolled on a professional training program for documentary filmmaking in Montréal at L'inis, from which she received two excellence awards. She has directed several short documentaries and two of them have been shown at international film festivals. In 2011, she participated of an exchange program with the University of Television and Film Munich, where she directed her short documentary *Die Letzte der Familie* (*The last of the Family*). It played as the opening film of the emergent filmmakers' track of the DOK Fest 2012 in Munich. Claudia's films often focus on issues of resilience, women's rights and arts using a poetic visual treatment.

Jean-Simon began his career in advertising, working as a strategist and copywriter. After having journeyed as a journalist in Latin America and South East Asia, he decided to pursue his love for documentary filmmaking, founding MC2 Communication Média. Over the past few years, he has produced more than a dozen documentary films. *Brave New River* (directed by Nicolas Renaud) won Best Emerging Filmmaker at Hot Docs 2012 and was part of the official selection at DOK.fest 2013 and RIDM 2012. *Silence is Gold* (directed by Julien Fréchette) was nominated for Best Feature Documentary (Jutra 2013) and Best Social Documentary (Gémeaux 2013). He also directed four documentaries: À *la rencontre de l'Homme qui brûle, Alléluia, Sœur Violaine,* and *Marchands de bonheur*.
